

Colorectal Cancer Screening

Al/AN and Whites, Urban Indian Health Organization Service Areas

Data show that colorectal cancer screening rates are significantly lower for American Indians/Alaska Natives (Al/AN) living in Urban Indian Health Organization (UIHO) service areas compared to non-Hispanic whites. Al/AN under the age of 65 are also more likely to be uninsured.

As shown in the table above, only 46% of Al/AN age fifty and older had a Fecal Occult Blood Test (FOBT) or Sigmoid Colonoscopy compared to 60% of non-Hispanic whites.

These statistics prompted UIHO representatives to apply and attend the Al/AN Dialogue for Action meeting in May 2007, forming the Urban Indian Colon and Rectal Education and Screening (CARES) project.
