[Tribal Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Grant Program](#)

This forecasted funding opportunity provides funds for the Tribal Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting Grant Program (THV). Funds will support 5-year demonstration grants between the Administration for Children & Families (ACF) and Federally-recognized Indian Tribes, Tribal Organizations, or Urban Indian Organizations to conduct community needs assessments. The grant will support the development of infrastructure needed for planning, implementing, expanding, and sustaining evidence-based maternal, infant, and early childhood home visiting programs.
