



SERVICES AND ASSISTANCE

The Urban Indian Health Institute (UIHI) has access to resources, information and data that can be used to better understand the health status of the urban American Indian and Alaska Native (AI/AN) population, identify health problems and disparities and provide information to support program planning, research, reports, grant writing, and advocacy.

Data Requests

The UIHI has access to health indicators from multiple national datasets, including surveys and data collection systems that provide information on the AI/AN population in the United States. A [list of the current sources of data and health indicators](#) is available on the UIHI website. Example data sources include vital statistics records through the National Center for Health Statistics, the U.S. Census and American Community Survey (ACS) and the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). Where possible, the UIHI can also provide Healthy People 2020 objectives and targets or other national standards for health indicators.

Resources

As a knowledgeable source on a wide spectrum of urban AI/AN health topics, the UIHI can recommend accessible and culturally-appropriate resources (e.g., materials designed or tested for AI/ANs) including community assessment tools, training, and program planning, and sustainability opportunities. In addition, the UIHI has produced many reports, fact sheets, briefs, survey instruments, and other materials that may include information on the health topic of interest to you.

Facilitation of Communication

Through a Weekly Resources and Opportunities Email (WRE), the UIHI provides regular resources, grant announcements, training, and other relevant public health information. The UIHI also maintains a contact list of people and organizations doing varied work in urban AI/AN health care and may be able to provide connections to facilitate collaborations, partnerships, or discussion.

Other Technical Assistance Services

The UIHI also has experience assisting in consultations on urban AI/AN health topics, conducting literature reviews, developing specialized materials (e.g., surveys, fact sheets, etc.), interpreting data, and assisting with presentations.
